#### **START WITH THE BASICS**



Write down your decision-making criteria and what information you need.

#### **BE A FLY ON THE WALL**



Examine the situation like an outsider would to help yourself think rationally.

## **USE CRITICAL THINKING TO:**

Look for patterns and connections

Assess risk and reliability Identify and challenge assumptions

## COME UP WITH POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVES AND EVALUATE THEM

#### BRAINSTORM

Consider the full range of potential solutions. Don't dismiss any ideas until you fully understand them.

#### **RUN A PRO/CON ANALYSIS**

to predict likely outcomes, Weigh the cost against the benefit of each option. Think about how you would address any negative consequences.

#### **INVOLVE OTHERS**

Your team members are a tremendous resource. Be sure to effectively communicate the issue with them.



## BASED ON YOUR ANALYSIS, MAKE YOUR DECISION AND ACT





### DETERMINE THE DECISION'S EFFECTIVENESS

#### **ASK YOURSELF:**

- What was the outcome of my decision?
- Was the outcome what I expected?
- Did I successfully manage the risks?
- What's the next step from here?

## **CEMENT YOUR LEARNING AND ADAPT TO FUTURE DECISIONS**

#### REFLECT

on your decision-making process and identify areas you can improve for future decisions.

#### CONSIDER

any biases or assumptions that may have influenced your decision, and work to address them.

#### **INCREASE**

your confidence to make future decisions by going over what went well.
